

Nike under fire for recalling flag shoe at Kaepernick's request

NEW YORK, New York — Business has been good for Nike since last year's "Just Do It" advertisement. The famous ad featured former NFL quarterback Colin Kaepernick.

Now, the company has listened to Kaepernick on a merchandise issue. He recently raised concerns over a Nike sneaker featuring an early American flag.

Kaepernick Says Flag Is Offensive

In response, Nike pulled the Air Max 1 USA shoe from store shelves. The shoe included a U.S. flag from Revolutionary War times on its heel. Kaepernick explained that the flag brings up a time when black people were enslaved. He also said the flag has been used by racist groups.

Nike recalled the shoes from stores. It was set to go on sale the week before the July Fourth holiday, according to the Wall Street Journal.

The decision caused instant anger among conservatives. They accused Nike of insulting American history. In Arizona, Governor Doug Ducey, a Republican, asked a state agency to withdraw tax breaks promised to Nike. The company plans to build a factory in the state. Often times, states or local governments use gifts like tax breaks to attract companies to their states.

Others expressed surprise that the symbol known as the Betsy Ross flag could be considered offensive. The flag is named after the beloved Philadelphia woman credited with designing it during the American Revolution. Some extremist groups appear to have used the flag for their own message. Still, it is not widely viewed as a symbol of hate.

Experts Think Nike Will Survive Backlash

Nike defended its decision in a statement. It said it did not want the shoe to take away from the Fourth of July celebration. The company also pushed back against criticism that the decision was "anti-American."

Nike is showing consistency by listening to Kaepernick. He was the first NFL athlete to take a knee during the national anthem to protest police brutality. This act continues to cause controversy throughout the sports world. After last year's "Just Do It" ad with Kaepernick, some people called for boycotts of Nike.

The boycott calls fizzled, and business has been growing for Nike ever since. The company's yearly sales have jumped 7 percent to more than \$39 billion. That's more money than some countries' economies produce in an entire year.

Still, the sneaker recall has led to new criticism. Several Republican politicians quickly condemned the company, including Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell of Kentucky. "If we are in a political environment where the American flag has become controversial to Americans, I think we have a problem," he said.

Matt Powell studies sports from a business perspective. He does not think Nike will suffer from the shoe recall. In fact, he thinks their stand will speak to customers who want to see companies reflect their values.

"Today's consumers really want brands to be vocal on social issues, especially the younger consumers," Powell said. "This very much aligns with the social position of their core consumers."

Flag Was Allegedly Used In A Racist Incident

Still, there's a question on whether or not the flag is offensive.

In 2016, the flag had reportedly been used to intimidate football players from a mostly black school. The incident occurred in Michigan and was detailed by a local chapter of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People. It is called the NAACP for short. The NAACP is the nation's oldest civil rights organization. It was originally founded in the early 1900s to fight for better treatment of African-Americans.

Lisa Moulder is the director of the Betsy Ross House in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. She said she has never heard of the flag being used as a hate symbol. "Personally, I've always seen it as a representation of early America," she said. "The young nation was not perfect, and it is still not perfect."
