#### Welcome and Introductions

#### May 14, 2013 Meeting Minutes – Approved

#### **Overview of the Leiving-Learning Communities (LLC)**

Robert Mock, Vice President for Student Affairs Justin Blevins, Assistant Director, Residence Life

- History:
  - o First community was established in 1989 in Engineering
  - Each one has a unique name and logo
- Growth
  - o Currently there are 13
  - There will be 14 in the Fall of 2013
  - o Some become obsolete or morph into a new one or an established one
  - Colleges put in the resources and programming with Residence Life coordinating the process and working the programmatic implementation primarily during evening hours
  - o The LLC has grown 166% from 2008 to 2012 in participants
  - From 2012 to 2013, it should grow an additional 103%
  - o From 2013 to 2014, it is projected to grow an additional 68%
- Retention Rates:
  - o Overall Fall 12 to Spring 13 retention rate is 98%; UK Cohorts is 94%
  - o Seven of the 13 LLCs have a 100% retention rate for the Fall 2012 to Spring 2013 time frame
- Academic Performance:
  - o Overall Fall 12 GPA is 3.26; UK Cohorts is 2.99
- Plans to Expand
  Expansion will parallel with the grown of the residence halls
  The goal is to have 80% of students in a LLC in 5 years, i.e. 2018

#### Academic Core

Ben Withers, Interim Associate Provost for Undergraduate Education, Director of the Honors Program

- Honors Program
  - o 40 to 60 students are in the Honors LLC
  - o 22% of Honors students are in other LLCs

- UK Core
  - o History
    - During the last SACS evaluation in 2002, it showed that it was hard to assess the University Studies Program (USP)
    - Question: should USP be revised or create a new curriculum?; what are the goals?; what are the learning outcomes?
    - It was decided to create a new program curriculum
    - Every students must take 30 credit hours at a minimum
    - The four components of Core are:
      - Intellectual Inquiry
      - Composition and Communication
      - Quantitative Reasoning
      - Citizenship
    - Colleges decided what courses would fit with the learning outcomes
    - It became an innovative curriculum
    - As of Fall 2012, there are 200 courses
    - The responsibility of the UK Core rests with the faculty
  - o Assessment
    - The Core Committee has a representative from each college
    - The Committee will meet soon to assess Core
- Two Communication courses in UK Core received the National Communication Association "Program of Excellence" Award
- The Chronicle on Higher Education did a feature article on UK Core, putting UK in good standing nationally

#### **Student Government Association Updates**

Stephen Bilas, President, Student Government Association

- UK Creed is now available on wallet sized cards
  - These will be distributed to each Freshman in the fall
  - Cats Cab New system to replace the evolving Cats Cruiser program
    - o RFP has been submitted
- Looking into establishing a memorial on campus to those that have been lost
  - o It was suggested that SGA look into integrating it into the Campus Master Plan

Roshan Palli, President-elect, Student Government Association

- Focus and promote the UK Creed at the Fall events and throughout the semester
- Will start interviews with the late night transportation
- Establish the Presidents Advisory Board bring student leaders together to discuss issues facing students and seek solutions

#### Student Health and Safety Committee

- Charged by President Capilouto, met for the first time on June 4, 2013
- The committee will explore all issues of campus safety
