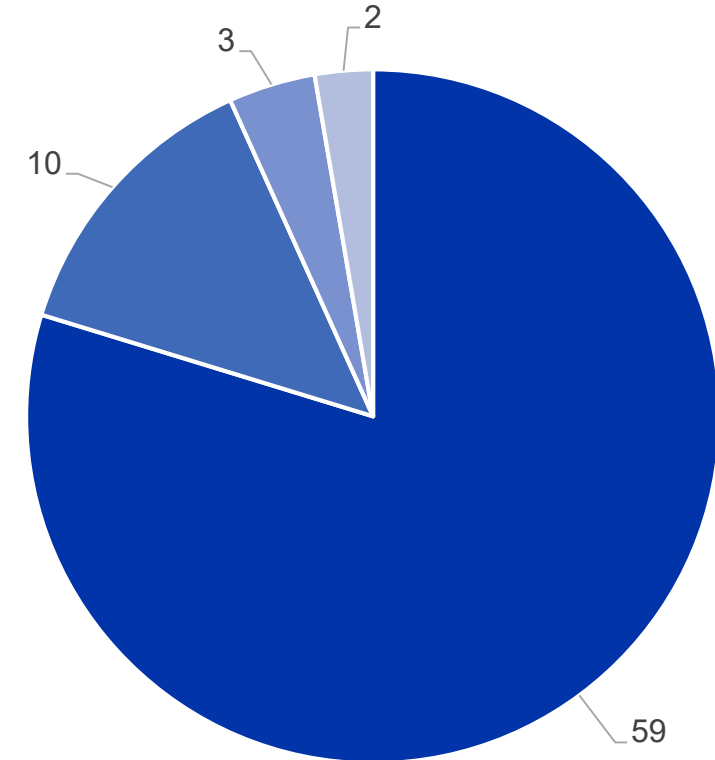

ACGME Institutional Self-Study Aims

Aim 3: Improve College of Medicine external communication tools to support recruitment

Aim 4: Resource GME programs to enhance recruitment efforts that support workforce diversity

Specialty Board Certification

Aggregate residency and fellowship specialty board certification rates continue to exceed ACGME benchmarks

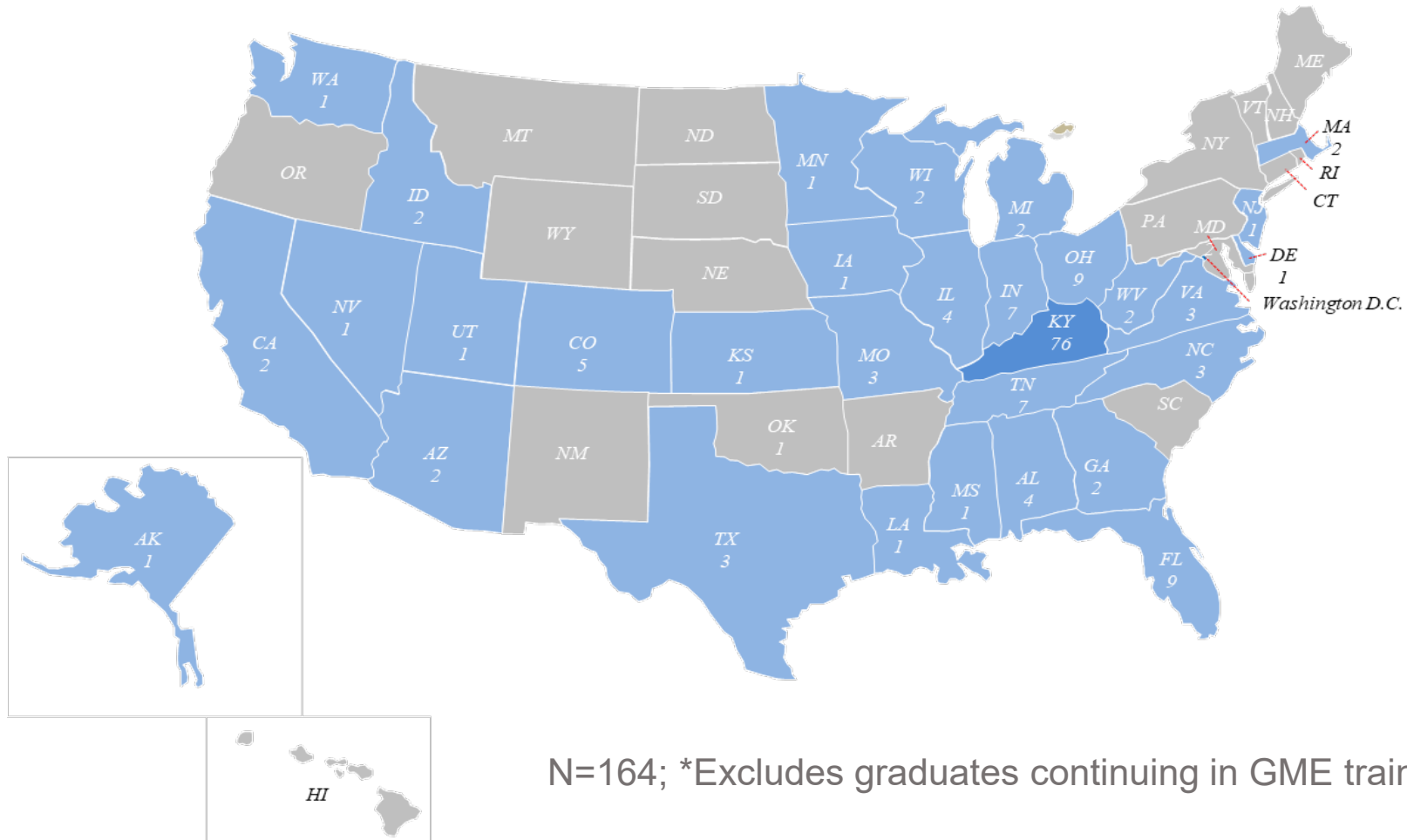
- 57 programs with board certification data available
- 47 programs with board certification rate greater than 80%
- 31 programs with board certification rate remains at 100%

2021 Graduate Practice Location

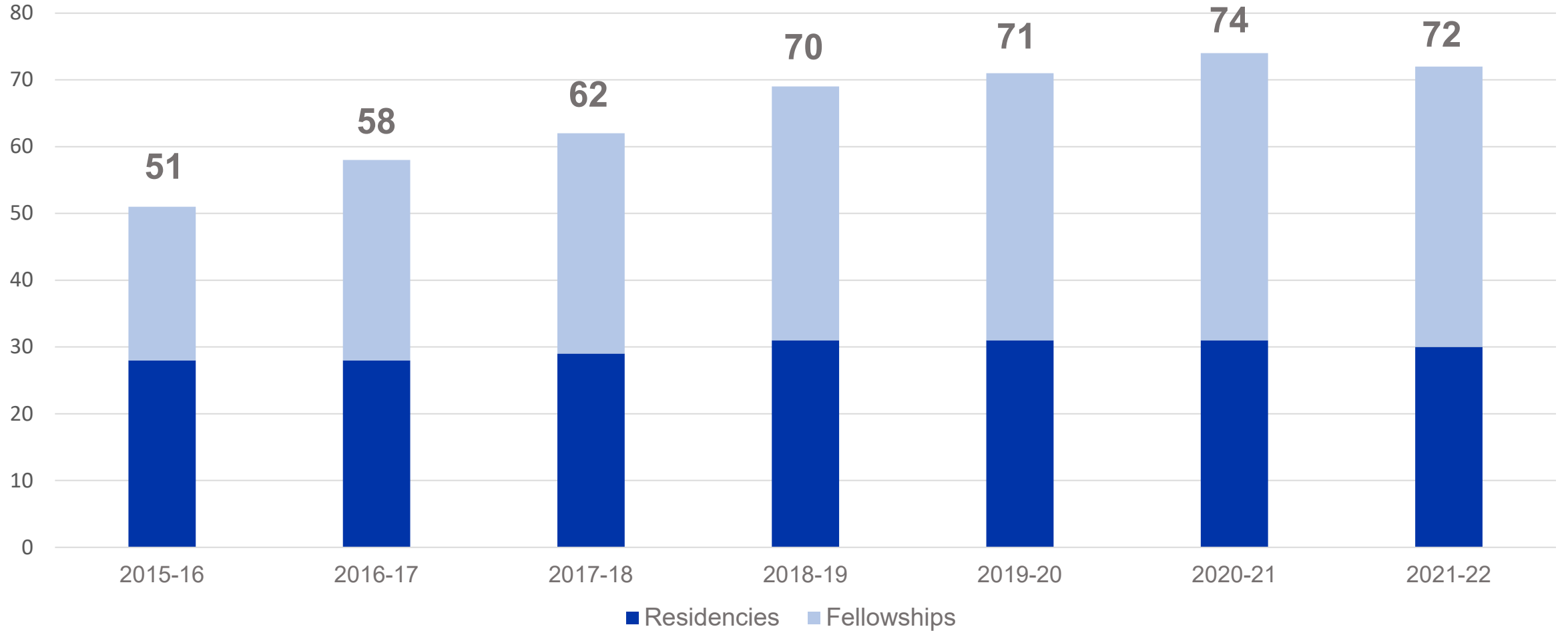
47% of residents and fellows going into practice stayed in Kentucky



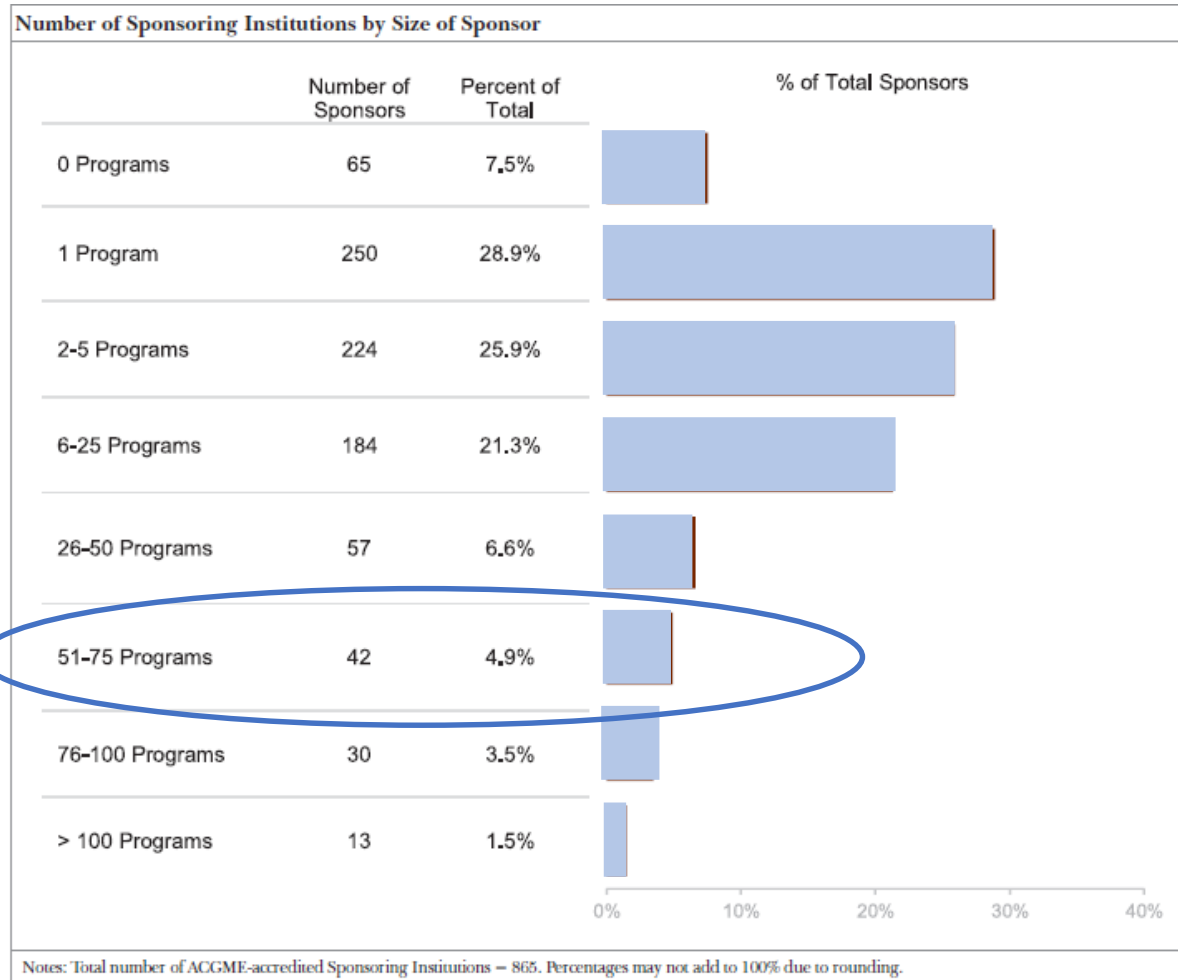

ACGME Accredited Program Growth

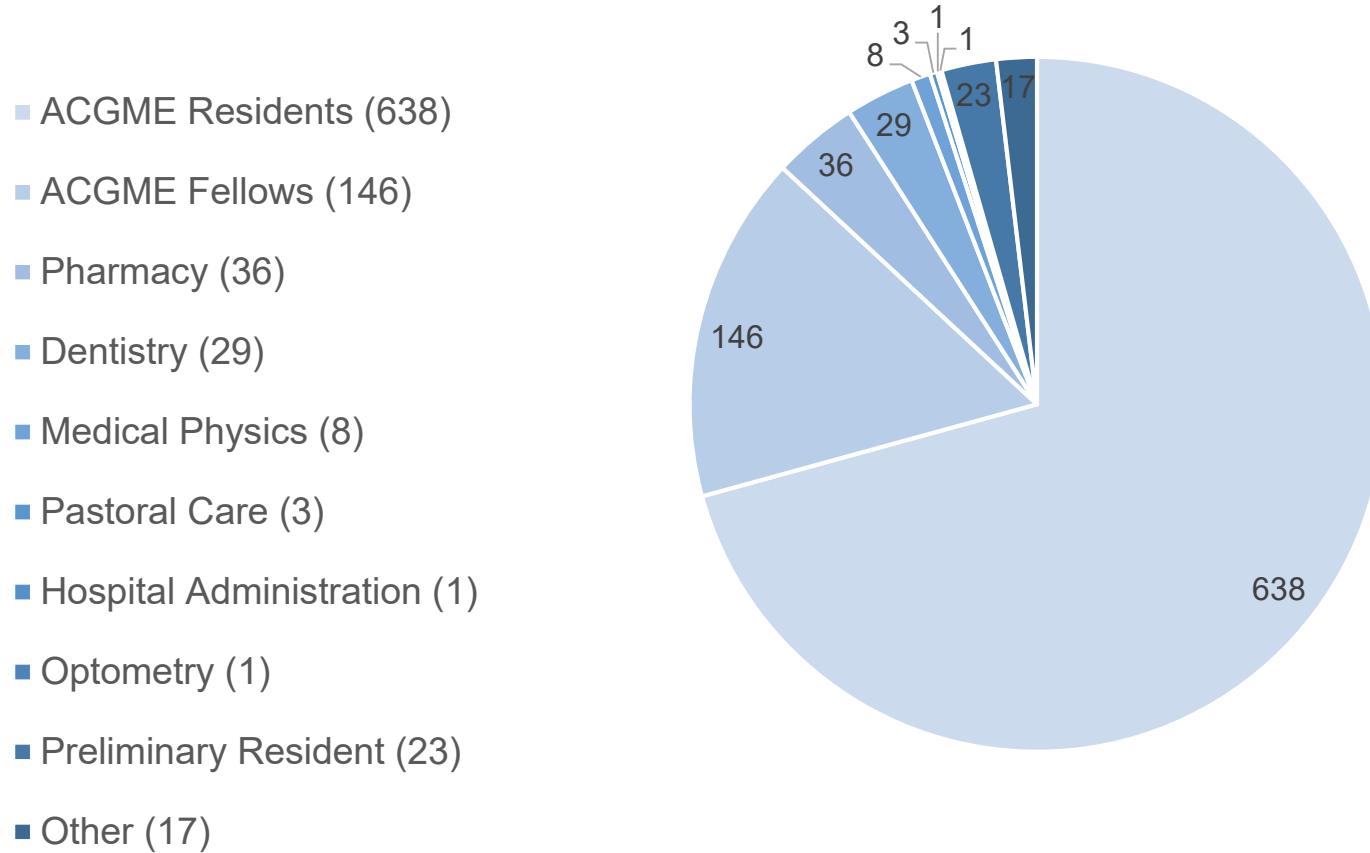


ACGME Sponsoring Institution Size



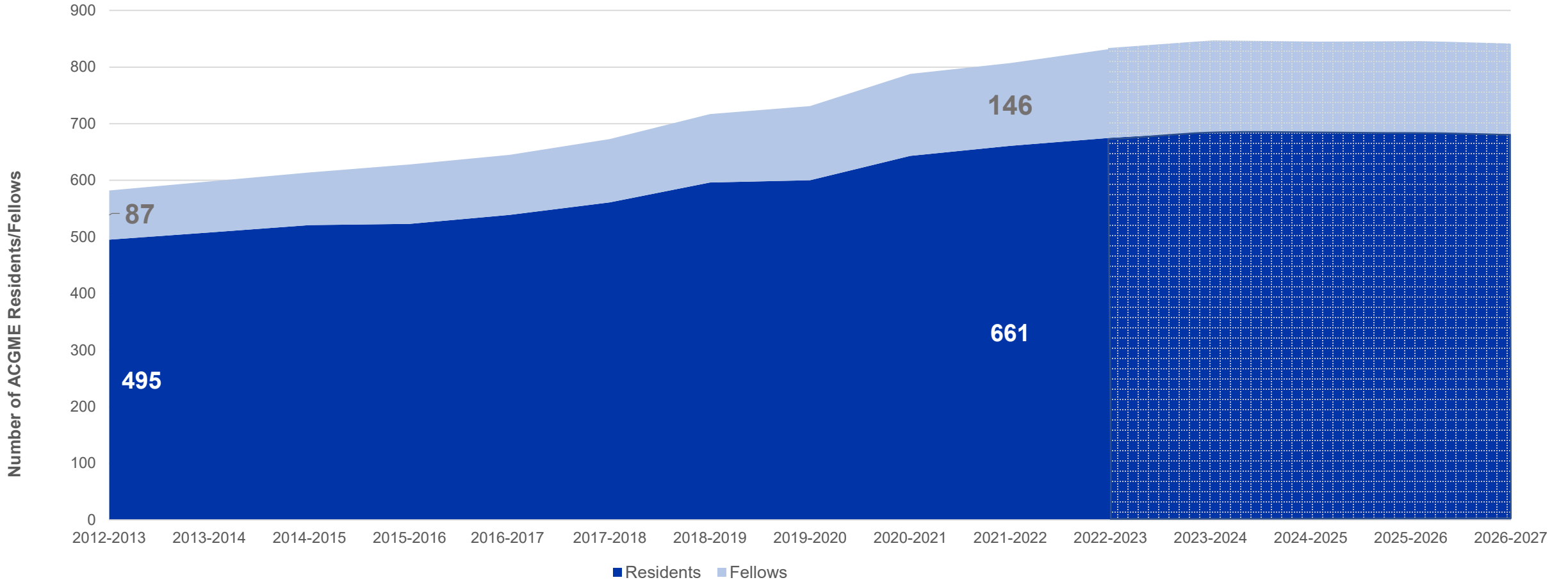

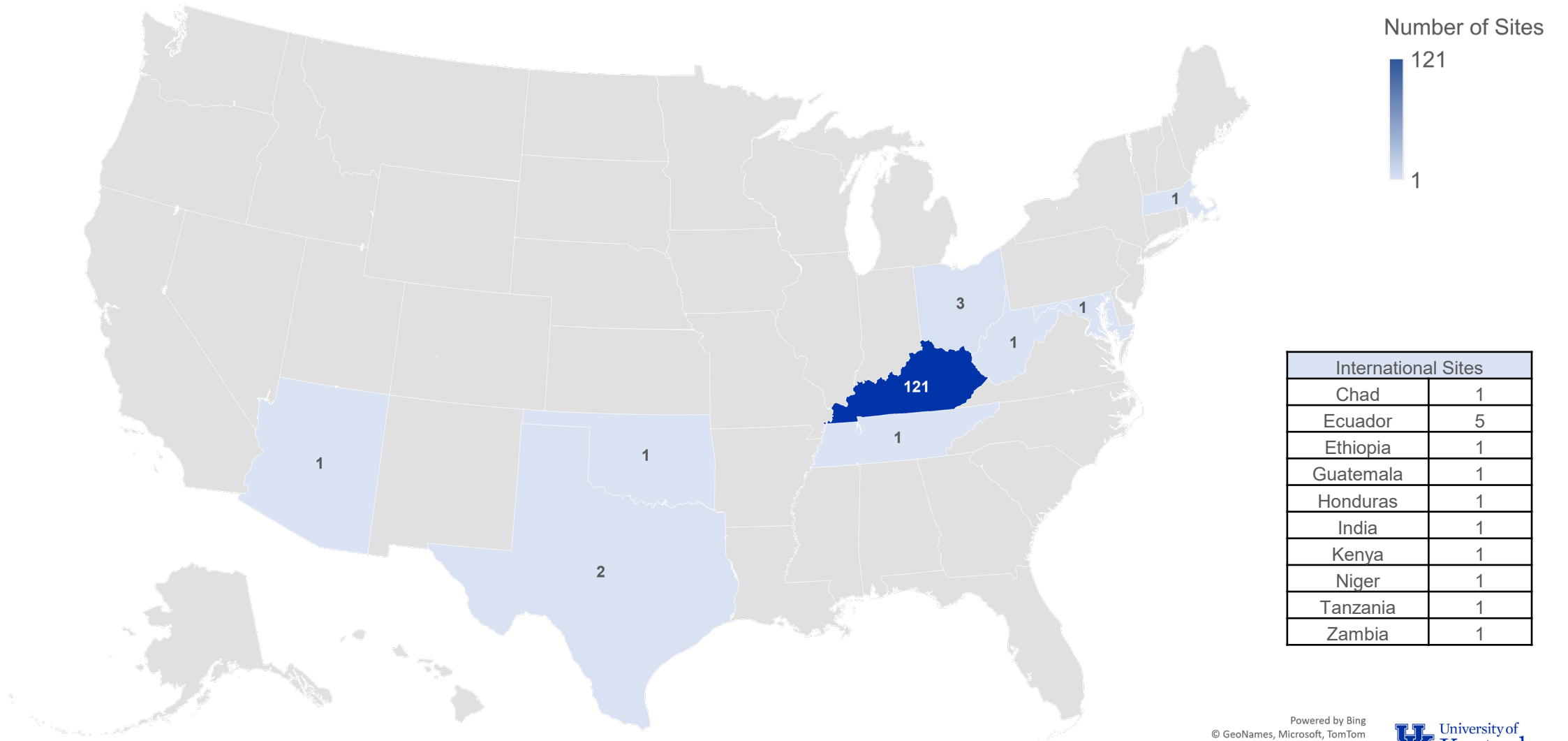
