# DISPOSAL OF PERSONAL PROPERTY

<u>Recommendation</u>: that the Board of Trustees approve a plan for Fiscal Year 2021-22 authorizing: (1) routine disposition of personal property having a value less than \$25,000 to include equipment and machinery; miscellaneous supplies and furnishings; vehicles; library books and materials; livestock and other agricultural commodities and products; recyclable materials; items with no possible future use; and equipment acquired as part of the Smart Campus Initiative; and (2) the methods of disposal as listed on the attachment.

<u>Background</u>: Kentucky Revised Statute 164A.575 requires that the Board of Trustees approve disposition of equipment and other property. Administrative Regulation 8:1, approved by the Board of Trustees at its March 2007 meeting, establishes the policies and procedures for the routine disposition of property. The proposed plan will provide an efficient and timely process for the disposition of such property having a value of less than \$25,000. Non-routine dispositions require specific approval of the Board of Trustees.

### ANTICIPATED DISPOSAL OF PROPERTY – FISCAL YEAR 2021-22

#### A. Equipment and Machinery\_

# C. Vehicles

Method of Disposal Public Auction Internet Auction Sealed Bid Price Contract Fixed Price <u>Reason for Disposal</u> Vehicles with excessive mileage and/or in need of major repairs

## D. Library Books and Materials

Method of Disposal Public Auction Internet Auction Sealed Bid Fixed Price Price Contract Transfers to Other State Agencies or Governmental Units, Educational Institutions, or not-for-profit organizations as listed in Administrative Regulation 8:1 <u>Reason for Disposal</u> Library books and materials that are obsolete, outdated, or not appropriate for library collections. E. Livestock, Poultry and Other Agricultural Commodities and Products

Method of Disposal Public Auction Internet Auction Sealed Bid Price Contract Fixed Price Retail Outlet <u>Reason for Disposal</u> Livestock, poultry and other agricultural commodities and products surplus to the needs of the College of Agriculture, Food and Environment or otherwise unsuitable for use (completion of research projects, carcass data requirements, normal culling of herds, agricultural commodities made as a result of operations such as mulch, grain, hay, etc.).

# F. Recyclable Materials

Method of Disposal Public Auction Internet Auction Price Contract Fixed Price <u>Reason for Disposal</u> To comply with regulations for proper and timely disposition of waste products and recyclable materials.

G. Items with No Possible Future Use

Method of DisposalTrashReason for DisposalSome items are broken or in such a state of disrepair they, if not recyclable, should be disposedimmediately as trash.

# H. Smart Campus Initiative Program

<u>Method of Disposal</u> Assignment to applicable student upon graduation. Sale to applicable student for depreciated value upon termination from University enrollment. <u>Reason for Disposal</u>

In accordance with the external vendor terms as part of the Smart Campus Initiative.
